Business Ethics	Business Values
Ethics refers to the guidelines for conduct, that address questions about morality	Value is defined as the principles and ideals. Which help them in making judgement of what is more important
Moral principle system	Induces thinking
What is morally correct or incorrect in the given situation?	What we want to do or achieve?
Magnitude of rightness or wrongness of one's options	It explains the level of significance
